



# **Silver Young Equestrian Leaders Award**

Getting Started - Please find enclosed your Silver Award logbook. The Silver Award requires you to complete 40 hours of volunteering with a British Equestrian Member Body over a minimum period of 16 weeks (there is no upper limit). If you are a Pony Club Member, please ensure that your Branch DC or Centre Proprietor is aware that you are working toward your YELA Award. It is essential that you comply with the volunteering hours and age restriction set out in the guidance notes.

We encourage you to make your volunteering as varied as possible, by doing this you will get the most out of the experience. This can be anything from supporting younger riders to helping at a fundraising event, the choice is up to you!

You must record all your volunteering hours in the logbook and get it signed by the event/activity organiser after each session. Please note it is your responsibility to keep your logbook up to date and to get it signed.

<u>Assessment</u> – In addition to your volunteering hours, you must complete the questions found in the back of the logbook. When this is completed, please return them to us for assessment by either email or post. Please allow two weeks for your submission to be processed.

#### **Silver Level Guidance Notes**

# **Entry Requirements**

- Aged between 13 and 25
- Completion of the Bronze Award
- Volunteering opportunity arranged that is linked to a British Equestrian Member Body
  e.g. if you are part of a Pony Club it is advised to have a conversation with the Club Leader
  prior to volunteering to make suitable arrangements

### **Syllabus**

- Complete 40 hours of volunteering with a British Equestrian Member Body
  - Volunteering to be completed over a minimum period of 16 weeks
  - Volunteering to be signed off by an appropriate supervisor
- Complete one of the following options:
  - a) Volunteer with a 2nd British Equestrian Member Body for a minimum of 5 hours
  - b) Volunteer at a National, Area or Regional event for a British Equestrian Member Body e.g. The Pony Club National Championships, RDA Regional Competition
  - c) Organise an event through the primary British Equestrian Member Body, evidencing the planning around the event, number of people involved, and any funds raised
  - d) Organise a one-hour volunteer training session for a minimum of 6 participants, evidencing the planning of the session and the content covered
- Complete Silver Award questions
