OBJECTIVES

- To enjoy learning about ponies
- To be safe near ponies
- To understand what a pony needs to be happy
- · To be confident both on and around ponies
- To know the basic points of the pony

SAFETY

- 1. Wear a riding hat with a Pony Club tag
- 2. Wear boots or shoes with a heel (not trainers or wellies)
- 3. Know how to walk safely around a pony
- 4. When riding, know how and why to leave a safe distance from the pony in front
- 5. Describe how a pony might behave if they were nervous about something

RIDING

- 6. Sit on a pony in halt and at walk
- 7. Hold the reins correctly
- 8. With help, carry out physical exercises such as:
 - a. Touch parts of the pony (mane, neck, tail, etc.)
 - b. Ride the pony away from the assessor at walk, turn around a cone, and go back to the assessor
 - c. Show trot (rising is not necessary) on the leading rein
 - d. Stop at a named point

e. Stand in the stirrups

PONY CARE

- 9. Know the name and colour of the pony they are riding 9. Give two examples of things that a pony needs:
 - a. Water
 - b. Grass and/or hay
 - c.Shelter from sun, rain, and wind
 - d. Other pony friends
 - e. Daily time in a field

- h. Legs
- i. Hooves
- 11. Feed a pony a carrot safely
