Dogs and cats

- Keep cats and dogs inside
- Walk your dog before it gets dark
- Close windows, curtains, doors and cat flaps
- Keep the TV or radio on quietly as background noise
- Make sure your dog or cat has a collar and up to date tag/microchip
- Don't fuss your animals if they are scared

Horses and ponies

- If you can, move them to a quieter place away from fireworks. Keep to a normal routine.
- Keep safe as horses can be jumpy and will run from danger
- Leave plenty of piles of hay around the field

Small animals and outside pets

- Give extra bedding so they can hide
- Move the cage to face a wall or fence or move inside
- Cover cage with blankets to muffle the sounds (leave a small gap for air to flow)
