Career Profile Paul Hagerty

Q. What is your job title?

A. Cross Country Controller and Commentator

Q. What did you study at school/university?

A. Nothing useful until I got to university where I discovered computing

Q. What are of the most enjoyable parts of your role?

A. Getting a large team of people, many of whom only meet once a year, to work as a cohesive team

Q. What aspect of your role would people find surprising?

A. The amount of preparation before an event and the level of activity/concentration needed in the control box

Q. What is a short description of your job role?

A. As a cross country controller I am appointed by the event organiser and it is my job to manage the cross country course, under the direction of the British Eventing Steward and the British Eventing Technical Advisor, to ensure the safety of the competitors, horses officials, volunteers and public, as well as facilitating the smooth running of the competition.

Career Profile Andrew Chadwick

Q. What is your job title?

A. Company Director - EquiSafe Ltd (Health and Safety Consultants) and Chair of Equestrian Safety Group

Q. What did you study at school/university?

A. I have completed a range of external courses related to my role including:

- Advanced Event Management
- Accident Investigation
- Terrorism Studies
- Event Safety Official and Competition Stewarding
- Criminal Investigation Intelligence
- Qualified GVC Aircraft Operator
- Emergency / Critical Incident Planning

Q. What are the most enjoyable parts of your role?

A. Seeing positive outcomes of successful event planning. Being able to work in the equestrian industry

Q. What aspect of your role would people find surprising?

A. The amount of behind the scenes work that goes on for a two day horse trials and how soon planning starts and changes in the run up, many different challenges and solutions

Q. What is a short description of your job role?

A. My role as a safety steward includes legislative compliance and contingency planning. In the event of an incident/accident, compliance with HSE reporting requirements and accident investigation. Proactive risk management is needed should new or ongoing hazards develop. Promoting a culture of 'reasonable practicable' solutions for health, safety and welfare of all involved including horse welfare.

Career Profile Meg Cappaert

Q. What is your job title?

A. British Eventing Volunteer, Event First Responder and Member of organisibng team for Chillington Hall Horse Trials

Q. What did you study at school/university?

A. GCSEs and A Levels, Young Equestrian Leaders Awards - Bronze, Silver and Gold, First Response Emergency Care Level 3, Conflict Management and Personal Safety, Joint Emergency Services Interoperability Awareness, Annual Statutory and Mandatory Training

Q. What is the most enjoyable parts of your role?

A. Working as part of an amazing team, giving back to the sport, experiencing new things through my love of eventing and emergency medicine

Q. What aspect of your role would people find surprising?

A. The amount of behind the scenes work that goes into making an event happen - riders never understand until they volunteer themselves! Also the range of incidents we have to be prepared for

Q. What is a short description of your job role?

A. When I was volunteering, I was a fence judge which meant I had to report horses over an allocated fence, award penalties should they need them and request appropriate support in the event of a fall. Now as a member of the organising team, I coordinate the volunteers and staffing allocations and assist with their briefings. I also create content for social media, run prize givings, liaise with sponsors, competitors and owners, and respond to incidents should they occur. As a First Responder at events, I am on standby to provide immediate, life saving intervention should it be required. As a team, we deal with a variety of injuries and illnesses from critically unwell patients to those that are on their feet and just need a check over.
