# OBJECTIVES

- To achieve confidence in handling a pony
- To achieve confidence in riding a pony
- To enjoy learning about ponies
- To have a basic understanding of pony behaviour
- To know that it is important that ponies are healthy and enjoy life
- To have an awareness of how ponies learn

## SAFETY

- 1. Explain why you need to wear a riding hat and suitable footwear when mounted and dismounted
- 2. Show how to approach and move safely around a pony
- 3. Keep a safe distance away from people and other ponies when riding

## UNDERSTANDING YOUR PONY (Dismounted discussion)

- 4. Show how to use rewards (stroking, scratching, voice) to train ponies
- 5. Understand how to soften pressure (release) to reward the pony when leading a pony
- 6. List two things that ponies enjoy doing
- 7. Talk about what happens when ponies are nervous or worried
- 8. Know some situations that might make ponies nervous or worried
- 9. Talk about some things ponies do that show they like to be with other ponies

## RIDING

- 10. Mount and dismount (a mounting block may be used)
- 11. Show a correct position in the saddle at halt
- 12. Hold the reins correctly
- 13. Know that when the pony answers an aid (does what they are

asked), you must stop giving the aid (release of pressure)

14. Be able to ride a quiet pony safely in an enclosed area, without the leading rein, in walk and trot

### **PONY CARE**

- 15. Approach and handle a pony safely
- 16. Catch a pony and put on a headcollar
- 17. Lead a pony in hand in walk and turn correctly
- 18. Tie up correctly
- 19. Recognise and use a hoof pick, soft brush, plastic curry comb, and mane and tail brush
- 20. List the basic needs of a pony in summer and winter
- 21. Describe how a healthy pony behaves
- 22. Name simple points of the pony
- 23. Name different parts of the saddle and bridle

- The items shown in bold are particularly important; competence in these items will be given emphasis by the assessor when considering the result
